PERPLEXING DEHUMIDIFIER

All summer we have been recording the humidity in the pool building and it has been in the high 70's before the doors are opened. So the new parts S & S Sheetmetal installed last spring have not solved the problem. We must get it working correctly before the cool days of fall arrive and we can't open the doors.

The service people arrived at the pool on Tuesday, August 25th and have cleaned a fitting in the water line to the dehumidifier since the error message indicates that the water flow is not what it should be and when the water gets too hot it turns the compressor off. After this happens three times the machine shuts down. They will check it Wednesday morning and if it still shows the same error message they will put on a pressure gauge to check the water flow into

the heat exchanger. If it shows the heat exchanger is not working correctly it may mean we need a new heat exchanger for which he did not estimate the cost.

I suspect that is the problem due to the fact that our water was so hot last winter without the pool heater on. So we need to be prepared to put some big money into the dehumidifier. That means we will have to use our fall fund raiser to repair it.

PARTNERS OF THE POOL FUND RAISER

Last year we held this fund raiser in place of our spaghetti dinner with the goal of raising \$4,000.

We ask that each pool member donate \$25 to the pool. For each \$25 donated we will give them a ticket towards a one-year free pool membership. We also have a quilt that was not picked up last year that we will give as second prize. We will draw for the winning tickets at our Annual General Meeting on Wednesday, October 28th. If we do not have to replace the dehumidifier heat exchanger we would like to use the money raised this year to replace our pool heater with an energy efficient one. As we noted last summer this will require a new configuration of the exhaust pipes in our pump room.
